Already decades ago—and even more than a century ago—people, organizations, and the state sought solutions to provide affordable housing. One such solution was **social housing**.

Today, **social housing** is once again being discussed and promoted as a key response to rising housing costs. However, what constitutes social housing—how it is defined, understood, and produced—varies greatly between national and regional contexts. In this seminar, we will explore the relevance of social housing and its architecture today, examine different definitions, and visit historical and contemporary examples from various parts of the Alpenrheintal (Alpine Rhine Valley).
